Luke 2.21-38

We meet Simeon and Anna in the Advent section of the Gospel of Luke. As characters of the Advent story, they seem to be the oldest people one will meet. Perhaps as the oldest people in the Advent story we would be wise to pay attention to how they were living in their aging years. While we do not know exactly the details of their lives at the end of life, we can be assured of how they were living at the end of their lives, and we can assume they finished well in the same way.

Our story begins in Luke 2.21-24, when Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple to be dedicated on the 8thday of his life where they unexpectedly meet Simeon.
